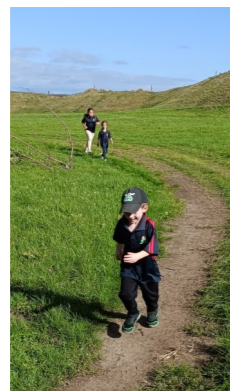
## Party Pigs Show now this Thursday
